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Introduction and Background

MVES is a non-profit organization with the mission to support the rights of older adults and people with disabilities to live independently with dignity in a setting of their choice by providing them and their caregivers with information, advice, and access to quality services and resources. MVES is a state Aging Services Access Point (ASAP) and designated as an Area Agency on Aging (AAA) under the Older Americans Act. The planning and service area is comprised of ***Chelsea, Everett, Malden, Medford, Melrose, North Reading, Reading, Revere, Stoneham, Wakefield, and Winthrop.***

Project Description

MVES issues this Request for Proposals (RFP) to solicit proposals from qualified organizations to provide activities, programming, and services to benefit older adults. Using available federal Older Americans Act (OAA) Title III funds, MVES will provide grants that strengthen the service network, address gaps in local services, and fund programs to benefit persons age sixty and older.

Activities proposed by applicants must benefit persons age sixty (60) years and older who reside in one or more of the above cities and towns. Participation in the program may be open to all age groups as long as the primary benefit is derived by persons age sixty (60) and over. Applicants should seek to give preference to older individuals with the greatest social and economic need, including populations who are marginalized and disadvantaged by gender, disability, social isolation, sexual orientation, economic situation, race or ethnicity, citizenship, cultural and/or linguistic barriers. Specific information regarding program categories prioritized by the Older Americans Act is listed below.

MVES Title III Grant Priorities

MVES will fund innovative programs that promote the health, well-being, and independence of older adults and that complement or supplement the support activities of informal caregivers. Areas of focus include:

- **Health Promotion Programs** that offer evidence-based programs including chronic disease self-management, diabetes self-management, programs to improve balance and strength for falls prevention or other evidence-based programs that improve the health and well-being of older adults
- **Support Services Programs** that offer a wide array of assistance that enable older adults to remain in the community with access services such as transportation, case management, information and referral, in-home services, or legal services
- **Family Caregiver Services** that provide caregiver counseling, group support, caregiver training, and/or respite care. Specific caregiver eligibility guidelines are as follows:
 - 1) Family caregivers of older adults age 60+
 - 2) Caregivers of a person with Alzheimer's disease or related dementia regardless of age
 - 3) Grandparents and relative caregivers age 55 or older of children no older- than 18
 - 4) Relative caregivers age 55 or older, of an adult living with disabilities age 19 to 59 **not** including natural or adoptive parents.
- **Social Engagement Programs** that reduce social insecurity and isolation of older adults
- **Housing Resources Assistance** to help individuals acquire and retain affordable and decent housing and avoid eviction

MVES encourages firms that are certified by the Commonwealth's Supplier Diversity Office as being a certified minority business enterprise or a certified women business enterprise to submit a proposal under the terms of this RFP and to disclose such certification in their response.

Grant Awards

Funding is contingent upon the allocation and receipt of federal Title III funding from the Massachusetts Executive Office of Aging & Independence. Contracts will be issued for one year with the possible option of renewal for up to one additional year based on program performance, existing need for service, and funding availability.

Due to the continued uncertainty related to government funding, MVES anticipates being able to support five to six grant proposals between the amounts of \$5,000 and \$15,000 this funding cycle. MVES reserves the right to increase the number of awards and/or amounts if fiscal support for the OAA increases. If MVES is interested in a proposal but cannot fund it completely, partial funding may be negotiated and awarded in which case a revised budget and budget narrative will be required.

State and Federal Requirements

- **Voluntary Contributions:** Grantee must offer participants in Title III-funded programs the opportunity to voluntarily contribute to the activities' cost. The charging of a fee for service is prohibited, and contributions must remain confidential. No person may be denied involvement if he or she chooses not to contribute. All contributions are to be documented and included in fiscal reports to MVES. Grantees must use such voluntary contributions to expand the services of the program funded under this grant.
- **Criminal Offender Record Information (CORI) Checks:** Grantees are required to conduct CORI checks for volunteers and program staff working in Title III federally funded programs.
- **Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Requirement:** If an activity requires participants to come to a site, the site must meet ADA requirements with provisions for emergency preparedness.

Reporting Requirements

Mystic Valley Elder Services will monitor all grants awarded as required by federal and state regulations. Grantees are required to submit monthly program and expenditure reports to ensure continuous monitoring. Payments to the grantees are made on a cost-reimbursement basis. All grantees will receive an annual site visit.

Technical Assistance and Bidders' Conference

MVES will provide technical assistance to all applicants up until proposals are due for submission. - Proposed Program Management - 20%
- Proposed Program Outputs, Outcomes, and Evaluation - 20%
- Preference to Diverse and Underserved Populations - 15%
- Age Verification Method and Voluntary Contribution Policy - 5%
- Project Budget and Budget Narrative and Justification - 5%
